INTRODUCTION



- The effectiveness of the organization is variable.



Comments

- The candidate shows some comprehension of the more straightforward listening tasks in Part 3A. S/he shows less understanding of the more complex texts.
- The candidate locates some of the relevant information from the Data File. However, a tendency to copy large chunks from the Data File means it is often difficult to judge their relevance.
- In terms of language, this candidate has mostly copied verbatim from the Data File. This often causes problems for the readers.
- On the occasions when this candidate uses his/her own sentence structures, the language is characterised as having severe grammatical problems.
- Register, tone and style is inconsistent. There is little real evidence of an ability to adapt material.
- There is an attempt at organization though this tends to be limited to the use of paragraph initial sequencers.

- There is an attempt at organizing the texts in Tasks 8 and 10 and this is probably the strongest aspect of this candidate's performance.


